MINUTES OF GLAISDALE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING held at The Robinson Institute, Glaisdale, on Thursday 16th January 2025.

PRESENT: Cllrs : TC, MH, CP, KA (Chair), CY

Election of Chairperson (due to absence of elected chair) : Proposed Cllr K Allanson, Agreed all members.

Period for public comment/participation (Max 15mins in total!)

Members of the public in attendance : 2

Two parishioners attended to discuss issues at Houlsyke regarding antisocial behaviour relating to persistent maintenance of, and storage of, vehicles on the C1 highway at the eastern edge of the village.

- Parishioners requested assistance of parish council to have this issue dealt with by either the police or the local authority as the nuisance has been ongoing now for well over a year without any improvement or solution.
- Councillors are aware of the issue and of the difficulties experienced by local residents due to the activities of one household in the village and have in the past tried to reason with the individual concerned by talking to him informally, so far without success. Both the police and the local highway authority have investigated but have not been able to find an appropriate means of enforcing a change in the perpetrators behaviour.
- Two potential courses of action have since come to light and it was agreed that firstly the parish council would write a letter to the individual concerned asking him to listen to the residents and find an alternative location off road to conduct his activities. The council would also contact PCSO Pete Lewis to look into using a 'Community Protection notice' to prevent these antisocial activities as well as asking NY Council to investigate the use of 'The Clean Neighbourhoods and Environments Act 2005 pt2 sct4' which dictates that the maintenance of motor vehicles on the highway is illegal if it is causing disturbance and upset to local residents.
- Members agreed that this is the only way forward in this matter and that the parish council does not have the powers to deal with the matter directly and so must pass this issue to those bodies with the powers to act.

 - 5.2 Report received from parishioner regarding issues with collapsed verge culvert at Mill Lane Lealholm.
 - **This issue has been reported by occupants of property on Mill Lane, Lealholm and is caused by large heavy lorries driving onto the verge when trying to allow other vehicles to pass. This results in the culvert collapsing and so preventing rainwater draining away in the normal fashion. The solution would be to either dig out the verge making the culvert visible and so discourage vehicles from driving onto it, or to bury a drainage pipe**

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in the culvert and backfill with hardcore to allow vehicles to drive over it without any damage being done.

- As NYC have already looked at the issue and stated that they are unable to offer any solution it was agreed that GPC would report the issue to NYC and ask that they reassess the problem before the issue increases in severity.

5.3 Request from NYC regarding GPC intentions for verge cutting during 2025 season.

- Members agreed that while the Model Agreement finances are still available then the verges should continue to be cut by GPC. Clerk to advise NYC accordingly.
